Year 8 have had fun raising their chicks. They arrive as day olds from the hatchery in Queensland. Students are able to compare the growth and development of both layers and meat birds during their 13 week course.

Lately we have been harvesting honey from our bees with our Year 9 and 10 classes. Three brave students put on bee suits and assisted Jason to remove full frames of honey from our bee hives. 
