





On Wednesday 15 August, four students, Riley Saban, Billy Sutherland, Ciarnah Robertson and Matilda Meringer competed in the State Boccia Championships held at Sydney Olympic Park. There were 16 teams from all around the state who had qualified for these championships. The competition was knockout style, meaning the team had to win each game to advance into the final.

The first game saw Woolgoolga High faceoff against East Maitland and come away with an 8-nil win. The team then had to compete against Heathcote High School and again came away with a victory 6-nil. The third game was a nail biter against Lake Munmorah High School; it was one of the closest games in the whole knockout competition but Woolgoolga came away with a 3-2 victory, making them one of only two teams to win all their games and advance to the grand final.

The grand final was against Narooma High School and they were fierce competitors being incredibly accurate with their throws. At one point in this match the referee who was measuring with callipers, could not even determine whose ball was closest to the jack to indicate the team to take the next throw. But thanks to the amazing teamwork shown by these four players, Woolgoolga High came away with a 4-1 win to see them get the gold medal and title of Boccia State Champions for 2018.

A huge congratulations to the team who demonstrated great teamwork and sportsmanship throughout this entire competition.

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



YEAR 7 ICT 2 — MINECRAFT EDUCATION EDITION

Year 7 ICT 2 (Information Communication and Technology) have been using Minecraft Education Edition to learn about becoming responsible digital citizens. Their class teacher, Mr Bordignon, recently completed a Minecraft mentor training day to help promote game based learning technology at Woolgoolga High School.

Minecraft Education Edition is an open-world game which promotes creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving in an immersive environment where the only limit is your imagination.



The students are set learning goals at the beginning of each lesson when they log into their Google Classroom site and complete the prerequisite theory. Once they have understood the task for that lesson, students log into Minecraft Education Edition and complete the practical activity. Mr Bordignon enlisted Phoenix Risby, who is a Minecraft Master, to set up a Minecraft world for the other students to learn the basics of navigating Minecraft.

Students then commenced mining, building and using the Minecraft menu and hot-bar system. Once the students were comfortable using Minecraft, tasks such as creating their own houses, building positive cyber safety sign posts and creating non player characters inside the were accomplished. Students were game, record messages positive required to of behaviour, thus promoting the importance of staying safe while online within and outside the Minecraft world. Students used the Minecraft digital camera and portfolio feature to document their work as well as creating and editing a short video showcasing their built environment.

Phoenix was instrumental in assisting students who had never used Minecraft to become comfortable using this engaging and immersive teaching tool. Minecraft gives teachers an opportunity to engage more fully with their students. It crosses all key learning areas as it challenges the students with game design mechanics, problem solving and collaborative learning. BTW it is fun as well.

WINTER WARRIOR CHALLENGE






On Wednesday 16 August, 30 PDHPE students ranging from Year 9 to 11 teamed up to participate in the 2018 Winter Warrior Challenge. 

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PA4E1- PHYSICAL ACTIVITY FOR EVERYONE our school's exciting new initiative



Physical activity is important for our health, not just our physical health, but also our mental, emotional and social health. However, physical activity tends to decline (by about 7% per year) during adolescence. Very few (about 1 in 5) adolescents meet the Australian physical activity guidelines of 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous intensity physical activity (MVPA) each day. As an example, anything as intense or of higher intensity than brisk walking is classified as MVPA. Or put another way, during moderate physical activity you can talk but not sing, whereas during vigorous intensity activity you will not be able to say more than a few words without pausing for a breath. Examples of MVPA include brisk walking, jogging, cycling and active sport time.

We also know that inactive adolescents tend to become inactive adults. So now is an ideal time to support your child to develop healthy physical activity behaviours to improve their long term health outcomes. With all this in mind, we need to work together to find ways to increase adolescent's participation in physical activity that can improve their health and wellbeing.

The PDHPE Department is excited to be involved in the PA4E1 pilot program which aims to improve opportunities for students to engage in more active physical activity. The PA4E1 flyer gives some details regarding this program.

To help support parents and students to increase their physical activity levels we will be including some ideas and tips in our newsletters and on our School Facebook page over the coming months.

Parents can contact staff members of the PDHPE department if they would like to discuss these ideas/tips further or can offer ideas or support for PA4E1 in our school or wider community.


