ATAR results released by UAC at 9am
Finalise uni course preferences by midnight
HSC results released at 6am via SMS, email and Students Online
First offer round for Year 12 students

HSC marking is underway, with results to be delivered to students on Monday 24 January. Students are advised to accept any university offer they receive. They can then remove this course from their list of preferences for the next offer round when they may be eligible to receive another offer. Students who receive an offer to another course can accept it and withdraw from their original course, or not accept it and keep their place in their original course.



Students who are descendants of an ANZAC may be eligible for a \$6,000 <u>Gallipoli</u> <u>Scholarship</u>. Open to direct descendants of an Australian or New Zealand serviceman or woman who has served in a conflict or peacekeeping operation from WWI to today. The scholarship is available to first year 2022 university and TAFE students. Applications are open until 1 March 2022.

#### **School Leavers Information Service**

The Australian Government offers anyone aged 15 to 24 a free chat with a qualified career practitioner as part of the <u>School Leavers Information Service</u>. Students are eligible for a one-on-one chat, 45-minute personalised career guidance session with a qualified career practitioner tailored to their individual needs. #### WOOLGOOLGA HIGH SCHOOL SCHOOL UNIFORM GUIDELINES 2020

The school colours are sky blue and navy blue. Our aim is to have the students wear our uniform so that a feeling of pride in belonging to the school is developed. Wearing a uniform also means students don't have to worry about peer pressure when it comes to their clothes (resulting in both cost saving and social benefits). Students should be encouraged to take pride in their appearance, presenting a neat and tidy image to the public. Uniform is also worn for safety and child protection and identification reasons as well as to meet NSW Occupational Health & Safety Laws as we are a workplace training facility. It is also a requirement under law that fully enclosed leather footwear must be worn in practical classes.
