### P&C

Outcomes from the Woolgoolga High School P&C Meeting held on Wednesday 9 November:

- Canteen prices have increased on bought products (e.g. milk, confectionary) due to product price increases
- ♦ Thank you to all the school staff ordering fresh lunches daily from the school canteen
- The P&C has agreed to fund shirts for the school's Agricultural Show Team student members
- Yondr phone pouch inspections have been occurring at school during Week 5 and Week 6
- The use of smart watches by students to pay for canteen purchases is not permitted. Canteen purchases must be paid via cash or EFTPOS card.
- Three of the school's science labs will soon be upgraded (Lab 3, 4 &5). This upgrade is expected to commence in the Christmas school holidays and will take around 14 weeks to complete.
- A new demountable classroom will be available for learning support for the start of Term 1, 2023


HSC Body of Work Visual Arts 2022

# YEAR 11 SOCIETY & CULTURE EXCURSION

On Tuesday, 1 November at 10pm, Mrs Wallis and HSC Students Freyja, Rianna, Mehak, Pravi & TJ, boarded the overnight train at Coffs Harbour and travelled to Sydney Central.

On Wednesday, we participated in the Society & Culture Association PIP Day at the Wesley Conference Centre. Over 1200 Society & Culture students from across the state participated in lecture style workshops about the process of completing their major work, the Personal Interest Project. This was followed up by a visit to the State Library on Thursday where the students were able to have a look and read some high performing (band 6) PIPs from previous years.

To make the most of our time in the city, we also visited the Sydney Jewish Museum and were spoken to by a survivor of the holocaust; visited Karen's Diner in World Square to gain further insights into the power of conformity in social behaviour and what happens when a group doesn't conform to expected social norms. Lastly, we had the pleasure of seeing 'The Lovers' at the Sydney Opera House which is Bell Shakespeare's first ever musical theatre performance. All students are now in a better position to commence their major work and had an amazing time enjoying a city environment.













## **YEAR 11 GEOGRAPHY EXCURSION**

Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> November, Year 11 Geography participated in their 'Ecosystems at Risk' compulsory field study to Dorrigo National Park Rainforest Centre, focusing on their next major case study, and complementing the work done so far on the functioning and vulnerability of ecosystems.

They had the opportunity to observe a highly diverse rainforest ecosystem, its geographical location and extent altitude and the effects on it of biophysical interactions, human impacts and contemporary management practices. It was great to be able to question a representative of the management authority about the global significance of the site, possible future impacts, and strategies for managing these.

They now have to complete a field study report and prepare for an in-class written task discussing the stress-es, impacts and management of this fragile ecosystem.


