# YEAR 12 GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP



Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November, HSC Geography participated in their 'Ecosystems at Risk' compulsory field study to Dorrigo National Park Rainforest Centre, focusing on their next major case study, and complementing the work done so far on the functioning and vulnerability of ecosystems. They had the opportunity to examine the world's oldest and most diverse rainforest ecosystem; its geographical location, extent and attitude; and the effects of biophysical interactions, human impacts and contemporary management practices.



It was great to be able to question a representative of the management authority about the global significance of the site, possible future impacts, and the strategies for managing these. We were also extremely fortunate to see a number of Australian Lyrebirds up close and observe their habits. We had stunning weather for the day, if a little cooler than

expected, and skies were clear creating a picture-perfect view of the escarpment and out to the coast. Students now have to complete a field study report and prepare for an in-class writing task discussing the stresses, impacts and management of this fragile ecosystem.

# PEER READING CHRISTMAS MORNING TEA

Over the last 13 years Library staff at Woolgoolga High have been curating the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) section of the Library and encouraging both staff and students to read. Over the last few years this has extended into the Peer Reading program and this year, to support classes and the COVID ILSP program. In 2022 a massive 128 students across Years 7 to 10 completed PRC, including 27 students who received Gold and Platinum awards from the NSW Premier's office for reading 4 and 7 years respectively. Again, this year, one Year 10 student will receive the NSW Premier's Medal at our Annual Presentation Assembly for 9 years of successful completion of the challenge.

In 2022 up to 76 students participated in the Peer Reading program, as Tutors or Tutees each morning in Home Group. Reading 15 minutes during Home Group each day has had positive literacy results for Tutors and Tutees and some students have formed bonds of friendship from the year-long program. On 18th November we had an end of year party and Tutors gave a book gift to their Tutees wishing them well and thanking them for their effort throughout the year. This has been a tradition in Peer Reading over the last few years that is enjoyed by all.

Congratulations to all students who are making reading a priority this year. Several events are on the horizon for 2023 to encourage students to read. Nominations for Tutors and Tutees for 2023 are being taken and any interested students (or carers of students) are encouraged to see Mrs Hart in the Library asap.

Just a reminder to record any texts read since 2nd September 2022, as these can be added to the Student Reading Record for 2023 PRC. Students are also encouraged to borrow items for holiday reading.


# CHRISTMAS READING CHALLENGE
