A SPECIAL NOTE TO PARENTS:

Our school is committed to building a safe and happy environment for students, staff, parents and the broader community.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Year 10 students not undertaking Work Experience during Weeks 8 & 9 are reminded that they must attend school.

Students not attending upcoming End of Year excursions must also attend school on those days.

Students attending upcoming End of Year excursions must meet the school's expectations which include a minimum 80% school attendance rate, consistent class attendance, following the school rules, and regularly wearing the school uniform.

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential.

Parents and carers are required to explain student absences from school within 7 days of the first day of a period of absence.

What does Year 7 look like? As part of their study of data in Year 7 Mathematics, Mr Young's class has prepared a set of infographics to represent our Year 7 cohort. To prepare this display, the students engaged with all aspects of data including:

- 1. Collection a census of all Year 7 students was conducted.
- 2. Measurement students height, foot and hand sizes were measured and recorded.
- 3. Data collation and cleaning and developing spreadsheet skills in the process.
 - 4. Summarising data including counts, medians, means, ranges and relative sizes of groups.
 - 5. Communicating their findings in ways that are meaningful and interesting to an audience.

As part of the Department of Education policy, all Year 11 and 12 students are required to complete the Life Ready Course. This year, our Year 11 students will be able to complete the course as part of an overnight retreat at the Great Aussie Bush Camp. Life Ready is designed for senior high school students in which they learn some commonsense lessons that will help prepare them not only for work but for the particular challenges they may face in the first few years after school.

Permission notes have been sent out via email to all families and I have also offered hard copies of the permission notes as an alternative option. Woolgoolga High School has heavily subsidised this experience and the cost has been brought down to \$100 for meals, accommodation, and activities.

"In the last school holidays, I decided I wanted to take it (the apprenticeship) up and I had a meeting with Dusty about it," Charlie said.

Charlie commenced his work relationship with Dusty at The Box Factory at Woolgoolga undertaking casual work. Today, Charlie works at Ground Earth after school and on weekends washing dishes, taking customer orders, cooking in the kitchen, and performing table service. Charlie said he enjoys working at Ground Earth and is keen to learn more about the industry through his apprenticeship. "I've got to the point where I've done everything, and I want to learn more, and I want to get on the grill!" Charlie said.

Charlie is also looking forward to "messing with the menu" and assisting other Ground Earth staff with coming up with delicious new dishes for their seasonal menus.

"It's a great fun joking environment to work in," Charlie said.

Charlie will undertake the training component of his apprenticeship in Commercial Cookery both at work and at home. Charlie has progressed through several of our school's Educational Pathways Program (EPP) initiatives undertaking offered courses and workshops to help determine his preferred career path. "The EPP helped build that work ethic in me and taught me to have a good mentality towards work," Charlie said. Congratulations Charlie!!!




