YR 11 - AG FIELDTRIP

On Friday the 17th March, the Year 11 Agriculture students visited Costa Berries farm at Upper Corindi. This excursion is a component of the syllabus in which students undertake a case study to investigate a local farming operation. The students were treated to a tour of the farm by Andrew and Sanjay from Costas. They explored the infrastructure of the farm and learnt about the technology used to optimise production of the Blueberries, Raspberries and Blackberries. Andrew spoke to the students about the integrated pest management systems in which they encourage and release natural predatory insects to manage pests within the system to minimise chemical applications.

The students enjoyed learning about the soil-less mediums used in the growing of the plants as a way to increase uniform production of the berries which coincides with their lessons on

intensive farming systems.

The most enjoyable part of the day however was the tasting of ripe, fresh raspberries. They were delicious. A big thanks to the Costas group and Andrew and Sanjay.

The family is holding an Auction at the Seaview Tavern on Saturday 29th April from 12-5pm to help raise money and have stated on Facebook 'We are doing this fundraiser to hopefully get an accessible van to house two power chairs, my eldest Oli can no longer access my vehicle at all. We just do not have the funds to get the vehicle we need which is a VW Caravelle Long Wheel Base valued at \$70,000'.




