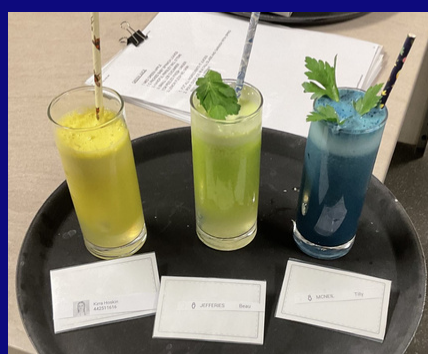
# ASSEMBLY OF EXCELLENCE

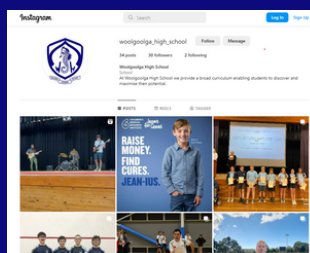




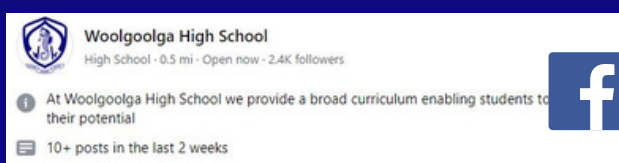
