In English this term, year 8 have been exploring the art of storytelling. Students have worked to engage their readers through appealing to the senses and emotions. The classes have approached this differently: through collaboration, exploring the meaning of context, developing a focus question and understanding how genre influences setting and character. Here are two pieces of writing from students who have researched different genres and applied it to their writing.

The half day entrepreneurial workshop by Media 4 Millennials, gave students the experience of a day in the life of a social media content creator. The students were taught how to use social media as a business tool and build a digital campaign for Facebook and Instagram on a specific product. The students also learnt about different social media careers, how to create engaging social media content, and how to take promotional photos for social media including different photography techniques. Workshop facilitator Steph Aceglav said "these skills have pretty much infiltrated every industry. These are highly desirable employability skills."
