





# Bushfire danger period information for parents and carers



### **Factsheet**

This factsheet provides information for parents and carers about arrangements for the bushfire danger period.

The NSW Department of Education has engaged external experts to conduct assessments of all NSW government schools, to identify schools at greater risk of impact from bushfires.

To support the health, safety and wellbeing of students and staff, the department, in consultation with NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS), will direct the school to temporarily cease operations on days when a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating has been declared for your school's NSW fire area. Alternative learning arrangements will be put in place for these days.

Schools may be directed by the department to become non-operational at any time based on advice from emergency services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.



#### What is a Fire Danger Rating?

Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a fire start. The ratings are determined by a combination of factors including air temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and drought.

## When will I know if my child's school has been made non-operational?

At approximately 4:00pm each day the Fire Danger Rating is issued for the following day. This means that schools, including onsite preschools, will be notified after school hours that it will be non-operational the following day. Your school will notify you as soon as possible by the preferred method of communication.

#### Parents and carers are requested to:

- provide up-to-date home and after-hours contact details to your school
- stay up-to-date with news and local media through the bushfire danger period.

What education arrangements will be in place if the school is nonoperational?

When non-operational, your school will advise of alternative learning arrangements, including any relocation or learning from home plans.

Woolgoolga HS Ag students undertook the Get a GRIP horticulture hands-on experience day recently.

The day had the group visit the TAFE NSW Trenayr campus and develop skills and knowledge focusing on growing, regenerating and producing with local industry representatives and TAFE NSW teachers. Students spent time undertaking activities in the career areas of conservation and ecosystem management, production horticulture and general horticulture.

The industry representatives were Grant from Yaegl Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation (Wadyarr Gargle Land & Sea Contractors), San from Provenance Propagation and Henriett from Clarence Valley Council who also had two apprentices Zoe and Casey. The representatives discussed their career journeys and the role they currently undertake. Students where guided on the training, skills and qualifications required for entry into a variety of careers, with the two CVC apprentices discussing their perspective of transitioning from school to work.

This program was developed and funded by the Regional **Industry Education Partnerships** (RIEP) in collaboration with TAFE NSW and Educational the (EPP) **Pathways** Program operating at our school, to ensure students leave school prepared well for higher education, training or work.





## Year 10 Work Experience

As part of the Year 10 program for Careers education, Woolgoolga High School students have the opportunity to engage in work experience from Monday 2 December 2024 to Friday 6 December 2024. This is a one week block during Week 8 of Term 4 2024.

Work experience is a valuable opportunity for students to gain an insight into the world of work, where young people can learn more about their future options. It can help students align their school studies with possible careers and future pathways. Students can explore an industry in depth, and learn a lot more than what can be taught from a careers advisor/guide or website article. Often, students will learn about careers they didn't know existed and develop their understanding of related pathways.

Work experience also enables students to develop and demonstrate their communication skills in an adult environment which will be essential for their success in the workforce in the future.

Students will be required to have the necessary paperwork signed and returned to the Careers Team by Wed 20th November 2024 to enable the Careers Team to check and process all documentation. A Quick Guide to Road Rules in School Zones

Driving in school zones is a serious responsibility and here's how to stay aware to make sure you're following the road rules.



#### **NO STOPPING**

No Stopping at all on any length of road to which a No Stopping sign applies.




